Minister's Letter

Oh, where are you going, And can I come with you, And what is your method For keeping alive:
No pack or possessions, No clothing or shelter, No food to sustain you – How can you survive?*



The Season of Lent remembers Jesus' forty days in the Wilderness, but it also reminds us of his last journey, to Jerusalem to be betrayed, arrested, put on show trial and executed. He probably made the journey with a heavy heart, fearing what lay ahead, while his friends were in the usual holiday mood of pilgrims going up to the Holy City to celebrate Passover.

We probably all have stories of our worst journeys – the train that broke down for hours and hours, the night stranded in an airport, the interminable queue on the motorway, that person sitting next to us on the train/bus/plane who... Or it might be that trip to the hospital, or the care home, or the prison, or..

Jesus didn't have to go to Jerusalem, he could have stayed in Galilee, but he chose to go. Many people around the world today had little choice in making dangerous and difficult journeys — because of war, famine, natural disaster, or whatever. Some have been misled into thinking that at the end

of their hard journey is a Promised Land, only to discover instead a living nightmare.

Jesus calls us to go on a journey with him through life. He does not promise that it will be easy, but he will always be there for us. And he calls us to support and be there for those making difficult journeys, to hospital, to a care home, a refugee camp, a prison or wherever.

I'm going on a journey
And welcome companions,
But don't ask me
How we'll survive, where we'll go,
Or who will come with us,
Or what we'll be doing.
Just join me in travelling
And learn all I know.*



Protecting children and adults at risk

Who are the Safeguarding Coordinators in St John's-Renfield Church?

Safeguarding is about preventing harm and abuse and making a timely and appropriate response if it occurs.

We have a duty to Ensure a Safe Church for All. This means protecting children and adults at risk.

Volunteering is such an important part of Church life and often goes on quietly and, sometimes unseen in the background, so thank you to all those Volunteers and Elders/Trustees who have given up their time to attend or have booked places on courses to update their Safeguarding training. This is greatly appreciated.

A list of current Safeguarding training courses has been sent to those who have not yet found a time or venue convenient to them. Please feel free to contact either of us to book a place on any of these courses.

If you are a volunteer and you no longer wish to do regulated work, or you're moving away, we would ask that you let us know as the Safeguarding Service require you to complete a Leavers Form. (GDPR)

Remember, if you are worried or have concerns about any Safeguarding matter, or suspect that harm or abuse is taking place, you should contact Moira Eaglesham or Marion Dowling as soon as possible. (Our contact numbers can be found on posters at various points throughout the Church buildings.) If the issue is urgent or immediate, contact Police Scotland or Social Work.




